<u>Mark 6 1-10</u>

Jesus left that place. He went to his own town. His disciples went with him. When it was the Jewish day for rest, Jesus went to their meeting place. He began to teach the people who were there. Many of them were surprised about the things that he was saying to them. They said to each other, 'We do not know how this man learned these things. We do not know how he knows so much. And we do not know how he does all these powerful things. Really, we know who this man is. He is the carpenter. He is the son of Mary. He is the brother of James, Joses, Simon and Judas. His sisters live here in the town among us. Isn't that true?' So the people there did not accept Jesus.

Then Jesus said to them, 'If a man is a prophet from God, people everywhere will say good things about him. But the people in his own town will not accept him. Even his own people and his own family will not say good things about him.'

Jesus could not do any powerful things in that town. But he did put his hands on a few sick people and he made them well. Jesus was very surprised because the people in that town would not believe in him.

Then he went to visit the villages round there. He was teaching the people who lived in those villages. Jesus asked his 12 disciples to come to him. He started to send them out to tell God's message to people. He sent them out two by two and he gave them authority over bad spirits.

Jesus told the disciples, 'Only take a stick for the journey, nothing else. Do not take bread or a bag. Do not take money in your pockets. Wear shoes but do not take extra clothes. In each town, stay at the first house that you go into. Continue to stay there until you leave that town.
